






#### THE POVERTY TRAPS

#### **Democracy Index 2019**




# RISING DEMOCRACIES

- South Africa
- Brazil
- India
- Turkey
- Indonesia



#### SOUTH AFRICA

- Improved quality of life
- Decreased maternal mortality rates
- Increased GDP (three times)
- Increased trade
- Secured 39<sup>th</sup> rank in World Bank's 2013 report "Doing Business"





- Brought poverty down to a single digit
- GDP grew within 25 years of democracy (ten times)
- Fall in infant mortality rate

# INDIA (excl. Kashmir)

- Economy doubled up within 7 years
- GDP expanded (six times)
- Literacy increased by 54%
- Top improver in terms of economic reforms in its region



## TURKEY

- GDP increased (three times)
- Infant mortality decreased (60%)

### INDONESIA

- GDP increased (five times)
- Maternal and infant mortality rates decreased
- Life expectancy increased








#### Hardly anyone has a mobile



GDP per capita in USD, 1950-2010


